1. The College Council voted in favor of recommending that the restructure proposal move forward.

2. Merve Unumatz is a Fulbright Scholar from Turkey who is serving as Scholar in Residence at Hawai'i Community College for the 18-19 academic year. She will be teaching <u>Turkish Culture and Language</u> in the Spring 2019 semester on MW from 2-3:15pm; those interested are welcome to sit in. Tuition-waivers have been approved for kupuna who wish to audit course.

3. VCAS Kaleiwahea has resurrected the Technology Advisory Committee (TAC). Currently, the committee is seeking two representatives, one from student services and one from faculty.
