Not only do we not need another meeting on our schedules, we should not limit participation to certain people who hold all the responsibility for making time in their schedules. Retention should be something we are all focusing on. The question is, where do we find time to do the extra work required to improve retention and figure out how to change practices. Therefore, I am granting faculty permission to stop all non-essential projects, grants, assessment, committee work, etc. to focus on student success in their classes with the goal of bringing them back next semester. In truth, nothing we do is non-essential, but if it doesn't have a deadline,	
	then I want you to feel free to prioritize the retention actions that we identify in the coming weeks and months.	

I will write a letter of support for any instructor's dossier who works on this project with us and has to set aside other work that would normally be reported in the dossier for contract renewal or tenure and promotion.

Our focus will be on two groups of students and data sets:

The students who failed last semester and notify their current instructors that they've been identified as possibly at risk. Put in place academic and basic needs plans for each of these students individually.

The students who are at risk for DFW this semester at midterm (now). Put in place academic and basic needs plans for these students.

We will create circles of support around these students and count our successes. So I invite you to weigh in on the discussions surrounding retention, if you have the time and inclination.
