	coordination with P-20 and UH IR folks. The analysis	
	shows characteristics of students, particularly new	
	students. First-time UHCC students coming to us	
	have declined since 2005, from 38%. As part of	
	IPEDS reporting we track first-time cohorts. Looking	
	at first-time Hawaii CC subgroups, we see that Fall	
	2019 had 698 first-time students, but by 2020 we	
	had lost 24%. Can see by the 3 <sup>rd</sup> year that only 19%	
	were still enrolled with us. 17% of that 698 were able	
	to get a degree awarded, while another 6%	
	transferred. After 3 years about 24% graduated or	
	transferred, we lost 56% of them. Looking at third	
	year outcome trends, as high as 63% of students	
	stopped out. This shows what areas we can focus	
	on to improve our retention rates of our students.	
	<ul> <li>Highlighted a report from Stupski, which showed</li> </ul>	
	great work with the fast application for high school	

- and early college students. Great progress. There are other opportunities we can improve upon; this is another data set we can talk story about.
- Chancellor wants dedicated time during the NovemberCouncil meeting to discuss the faculty work-life survey results that were shared with her and the admin team. She appreciates everyone that responded, as it becomes a launch for discussion.
  - There is a link to the analysis that they performed; they tried to do quantitative and qualitative analysis, but weren't provided a lot of qualitative information, so the next step is to open discussion and talk with faculty to learn more. She is also going to try to explore other mechanisms for people to join and talk story. She has seen from faculty about faculty burnout, staffing and backfill, program realignment, retirement/resignations, and here are some ideas on how to support that.
  - We do still have to navigate the budget freeze, but the Admin team is working with HR and is committed to hire and proceed with hiring as fast as possible.
  - There was also a lot of feedback about campus functionality improvements. What this established is that faculty and staff are eager to step up and do service – come in and paint buildings, etc.
     Wants to reflect on our facilities, make sure they provide functionality for employees and students.

Christine Quintana: Student Affairs has been reviewing various policies to make sure they are still relevant.

Kenoa Dela Cruz: HAW 7.521 is the academic renewal policy, which has been in place since 2009. The subcommittee looked at the current policy and also referred to samples, including similar policies from UH Hilo and UH Maui College (who based their policy off of ours).

- We cleaned up the language in referring to Hawaii CC;
- added the purpose of the policy;
- mentioned students who are receiving veteran's benefits, as they'd need to inquire with a veteransrelated staff member.
- We also added that academic renewal doesn't repeal or replace the repeating course policy that the College already has, or the exception process.
- We also cleaned up some of the language and made readability changes.

For those unfamiliar with the policy: A student has the opportunity to have one Hawaii CC semester excluded, although it still remains on their transcript.

Chair DuPuis: Asking RReps to take this out to their constituents; any questions can go to Christine or Kenoa. This will come up for second reading on November 4<sup>th</sup>; if anyone still has concerns or needs more time for their

We are reading "Year of Grading for Equity", and want to spread the news and encourage everyone to join. The meeting will be held in Kaneikeao and there will be refreshments; they are also meeting by Zoom if you want to attend that way. You don't have to have read the book to attend, it's a discussion book club, sharing ideas that will help students be successful.

Melanie met with a faculty member last week whose class was on the list for having high D's and W's. They took a deep dive into the data and learned that the problem was the W's, not the grading. They came up with some easy ideas that they'll put into place, partly by using support services already in place here at the College. She is hoping this is how it will go, focusing on solutions for student

	success, and not focusing on the instructor – more of a	
	holistic focus on how to help students in the course. Thank

	Renewal of digital tools, including Kahoot and Edpuzzle: If you are interested in any of those, let Melanie know and she'll connect you to the right person.	
	AAUW (American Association of University Women) will allow students to become members for free. While on an AAUW retreat in Volcano last month, Melanie was inspired to start an internship program here on Manono campus, as other campuses already have them. She made a connection with some students from other campuses and is hoping to start that here. Michelle Phillips, Claudia Wilcox-Boucher, and Jen Sims were all at that retreat, folks can reach out to them if interested.

Student fees are currently suspended, Christine further has recommended they be suspended for Spring 2023.

Emergency relief: Committee has been working hard to get money out to students. Quick recap: about \$383,000 has been awarded to 386 different students; they still have some pending funds for non-credit students and credit students.

DSA workshops: Click on the link in her report, there are faculty and staff workshops as well as a list of different workshops that different DSA members are putting on for the campus. Counseling has put together different workshops for students, so please encourage students to participate. There will be different topics throughout the school year, so please help students sign up for workshops.

	Early Alert: Mahalo to all instructors who submitted referrals. We miss Starfish because it automated that process, but we are now using Google Forms to identify students who need support. So far, we've received 102 referrals for 97 students. Counselors are now reaching out to those students, and close-the-loop emails will be sent to instructors. Starfish was helpful in the sense that we could refer multiple students more efficiently; now that it's in Google Forms, we're identifying students individually.
