We last reviewed it in 2016 and it was approved by BOR 2018. We don't have to revise it but we do need to review it. Kalani also proposed that we review our ILOs and our Kauhale statement. We also need to review the Hawaiian text as well. Kalani noted that it would be best if we can review and approve all these guiding statements by this semester.
