Robert's Rules of Order on Voting	In the usual situation, where the rules require either a "majority vote" or a "two-thirds vote," abstentions have absolutely no effect on the outcome of the vote since what is required is either a majority or two thirds of the votes cast. On the other hand, if the rules explicitly require a majority or two thirds of the members present, or a majority or two thirds of the entire membership, an abstention will have the same effect as a "no" vote. Even in such a case, however, an abstention is not a vote and is not counted as a vote. [RONR (12th ed.) 44:1, 44:3, 44:9(a); see also p. 66 of RONR In Brief.]

4. Senate Chair Report	a) Welcome and reintro Executive Committee members b) Kimberley Collins, HawCC VCAA (Vice Chancellor Academic Affairs) - greeting and sharing ★ Kimberley Collins ○ The Vice-Chancellor talked about her background;		

- Her focus since April has been on our campus and the Hawaiian culture;
- She welcomes feedback and she is grateful for those of us who has been willing to share feedback with her;
- She hopes to meet with all academic faculty in person at their primary location;
- Her calendar is open to everyone in the Hawai'i system.
 What you need to do if you want to see her calendar is subscribe to it: just go in and add a calendar and when you pick her you will be able to add it because it is open to everyone;
- She wants to work and support the employees;
- She wants everybody to be able to have access to important information that they need to excel in their position;
- o Her goals are:
 - Staffing,
 - Budget transparency (have the information and the approvals at the level closest to the people understanding why we are spending the money),
 - TE (I want to make sure that we are accurately reflecting our TE's in courses and reassign time and that this is in accordance with policy and part of that understanding is understanding why we may need exceptions or differences in policies;
 - And her final big goal is this idea of Hyflex (we offer so many programs to our Island and we have to serve all the needs of our Island, so how do we do

that by leveraging technology knowing our students might not be able to make it into class one day? So you know it is online, it is video and it is face-to-face because generally students do better face-to-face and there are a lot of disciplines that require face-to-face. This is a long-term way to think about it because faculty need to be compensated for the effort involved in delivering in multiple different ways. She would like to create a five-year plan and be the example for the whole state of how to do this in a sustainable way),

- She would like to get feedback from us about how to celebrate and make connections,
- She would like to get feedback from us about what is the best way to communicate to us individually and to the campus.

 - There will be three reorganization proposals that are going to the college council next month. In 2018-2019, there was a very big complex reorganization proposals that went through the College Council and then to the System. From the System, they said to hold off and to break things up. That didn't happen, probably as many things, didn't happen because of COVID-19;
